DID YOU KNOW?

Nearly 1,800 black babies are aborted every day in the U.S.(1)

African-Americans make up about ten percent of Pennsylvania's population, yet black women account for 38 percent of abortions in the state.(2)

Since 1973, more than twice as many blacks have died from abortion than from heart disease, cancer, accidents, violent crimes, and AIDS combined.(3)

Over 20 million African-American children have died since Roe v. Wade made abortion legal for any reason throughout all nine months of pregnancy. (4)

Black women are more than three times as likely as white women to have an abortion. (5)

In Philadelphia, nearly 14,000 black children were aborted in just one year. (6)
